A friendship is forged between the man and the ghost over stolen food, shared jokes and love for fried chicken and single malt. But soon such light hearted banter takes a more serious and personal tone when the two are forced to look at their own pasts – forcing them to dig deep into their soul and bare their innermost experiences. #### Kallumama (Uncle Kallu) by Ushneek of Kolkata, India

The play begins with Kallu getting killed by his gang and reliving the events of his life. His narrative is tinged with sarcasm and bitterness at times, and tongue-incheek during other times. But listen carefully and one will hear the undercurrent of pain and suffering. Born into a decadent landholding family in Bangladesh. but orphaned by the time he turns sixteen, he is tossed into a vortex of events that make him a dreaded criminal. This play explores his life as a microcosm of the socioeconomic political situation of Bengal after partition and the creation of the "anti-social."

### Suman Mukhopadhyay

Suman Mukhopadhyay is a National Awardwinning film director, actor, and playwright who works with various cities and universities in the USA on Fullbright Fellowship, film festivals, lectures and theatre demonstrations. Suman's awards include National Award for Best Bengali film (Herbert), Best Director award at Philadelphia and Mexico, and Gran Prix award at Sarajevo. In addition to Herbert, Suman's notable films include Putulnacher Itikatha, Nazarband, Sesher Kobita, Asamapta, Kangal Malsat, Mahanagar@Kolkata, Chaturanga, and Posham Pa. With an early beginning at



'Kolkata's famous Chetana' theatre group led by his father Arun Mukhopadhyay, Suman created masterpiece theater productions from literary works of famous Bengali authors and adaptations of European drama. To name a few: Teestapaarer Brittanto, King Lear, Mephisto, Bisarjan, Aajker Shahjehan, and Bechara BB. Suman's Lenin Sharanite Bhanu created a sensation at the 2023 NABC.

#### Moncho Gaan

Ebong TheatriX is privileged to have had the opportunity to work with Suman with his local production of "Shunyo Shudhu Shunyo Noi" at last year's festival, and the current presentation of "Moncho Gaan" (Songs from the stage). Bengali stage theatre has a rich tradition of songs and music. The lineage came from our folk traditions where music and songs played a vital role in story telling. Bengali theatre adapted the tradition in a very creative way. While there is a huge basket of theatre songs in this genre, Suman will be presenting glimpses of past and contemporary songs. ### The Maestros

### Debshankar Halder

Debshankar Halder, is the stage-legend and superstar of today's Bengali Theater. Since the '80s, Debshankar has acted in numerous plays with eminent groups, e.g., Nandikar, Rangapat, Natyaranga, Sudrak, Gandhar, Bratyajon, Sansriti, Blank Verse, Purbo-paschim, Mukhomukhi and Chetona, among others. An iconic actor known for his versatility, he fascinated us by playing Debabrata Biswas in 'Ruddha Sangeet', Girish Ghosh in Ek Moncho Ek Jeebon and Oedipus in King Oedipus just to name a few among the 60 plays with lead roles. Debshankar is the only actor for whom a theatre festival was held in 2010 to feature



his plays. He has been recipient of the highest award for performing arts– Sangeet Natok Academy Award from the President of India, as well as other prestigious awards, e.g., ABP Ananda Sera Bangali Award for Best Actor, Banga Bhushan, and Bengali stage centenary Star Theatre award. Currently he has 18 running plays with him as the lead in cast.

Debshankar has worked in various roles in more than 25 films, some with lead characters as well, e.g., Aleek Shukh, Maya Mridongo, and Tadonto. He anchored popular TV shows such as Happy Parents Day and Apni Ki Bolen and several TV serials, e.g., Lakhmi Kakima, Rudrabinar Obhishap, Dujone, Byomkesh, among others. He has several audio drama albums to his credit, including Shesher Kobita and Nisshongo Samrat.

In the early part of his career, Debshankar was closely associated with Nandikar's Children's Ensemble where he wrote and directed over 40 children's plays, including the much acclaimed Bhalo Manush Noigo Mora.





### Subhasish Mukherjee

Over the last forty-five years, the prolific Subhasish Mukherjee has earned a name as an actor and has acted in more than 200 films and numerous plays. Subhasish contributed significantly to the Bengali theater through his diverse roles in numerous productions including Ajker Spartacas, Lambokarno Pala, Kornik, Jharer Kheya, Bisharjan, Dragon Bodher Pala, Buchner, Ghar, Khela Bhangar Khela, Parul Bone Robi, Meghe Dhaka Tara, and Agnijatak. He has collaborated with noted theater personalities including Jochhon Dastidar, Debkumar Bhattacharjee, Sunil Das, Shyamal Ghosh, Suranjana Dasgupta,



Ishita Mukhopadhyay, Bratya Basu and Suman Mukhopadhyay. He has worked in theater groups including Nakshatra, Charbak, Sanbarta, Antarmukh, Binodan, Nirbak Academy, Naihati Bratyajan, Ushneek and Chetana. He is the cofounder and current President of Ushneek. Subhasish's debut film was Chhoto Bokul Purer Jatri by Purnendu Patri. Since then, he has worked with numerous directors including Tapan Sinha, Purnendu Patri, Buddhadeb Dasgupta, Utpalendu Chakraborty, Sandip Ray, Raja Sen, Prabhat Roy, Swapan Saha, Aparna Sen, Kamaleshwar Mukhopadhyay, Bappaditya Bandhopadhyay, Suman Mukhopadhyay, and Anjan Dutta. In particular, his performances in 'Shilpantar' (Dir. Bappaditya Bandhopadhyay), and 'Herbert' (Dir. Suman Mukhopadhyay) won critical acclaim from critics and audiences, and the film Herbert won the National Award. He has won numerous awards including BFJA (Twice), Uttam Kumar Award, Promotesh Barua Award (Thrice), Dishari Award, All India Critics' Awards, Utpal Dutta Samman, and Zee Television Award.

### Ishita Mukhopadhyay

Ishita Mukhopadhyay founded the theatre group Ushneek and has been the in-house director for Ushneek for almost 35 years. Ushneek performed in prestigious festivals like Nandikar National Theatre Festival, Narir Mancho Theatre festival, Cuttack International Festival, Sangeet Nataka Academy Festival, and 8th theatre Olympics to name a few. Ishita directed her first play 'Ghar', an adaptation of Jean Paul Sartre's 'The Room,' when she was just 20. She performed as an actor under the direction of Salil Bandhopadyay, Sunil Das, Manoj Mitra, Aloke Ranjan Dasgupta, Wolfram Mehering and others. She received several accolades, e.g., 'Uttam Kumar Award',



Pramathesh Barua Award', 'All India Critics Award', 'All India Women Association Award', 'Kalaratan Award' in consecutive years as best director for plays like 'Kamalkamini' and Gawaharjaan'. She received a Senior Fellowship from the Ministry of Culture, worked as a journalist in various reputed print media, and scripted/directed tele-serials such as Arabya Rajani, Ron Ruby Runa, and documentary films such as Alkaap, Kathokatar Kato Katha. Ishita also directed Kallu Mama which will be performed by Deb Shankar Halder at this Festival.

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

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

### **Celebrating Centurions**

### Habib Tanvir

Habib Tanvir the illustrious theater director of India. was born on the 1st of September 1923 in Raipur, Madhua Pradesh. A luminary in the realm of Indian theater. Habib was a prominent figure in the Indian People's Theater Association (IPTA). His directorial journey took flight with the historic production of "Agra Bazar" in 1945. Astonishingly, nearly eight decades later, this production continues to resonate and remains. relevant in the modern theatrical landscape. While he absorbed the nuances of Western theater forms during his time as a student at the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art in



England, his heart and soul remained dedicated to the folk and marginal art form, "Naach" of Madhya Pradesh. Throughout his life, he served as a nurturing force, shaping and guiding countless young artists who would go on to make their mark in the Indian theater.

Among his most celebrated creations stands "Charandas Chor," a production from 1975. This groundbreaking endeavor featured 72 young actors and earned accolades for its brilliance. His repertoire boasts other notable works like "Mitti Ka Gari," "Kamdev Ka Apna Basant Writu Ka Sapna," "Ponga Pandit," and "Uttaramcharit." Habib Tanvir's unique ability to seamlessly blend traditional folk formats with folk stories and adaptation of ancient Sanskrit plays, redefining Indian theater and creating a new genre that drew deeply from Indian tradition while reaching out to the world at large.

His exceptional contributions were recognized with numerous awards, including the Sangeet Natak Academy Award, Kalidas Samman, and the Padma Bhushan, to name a few.

As we mark the centenary of his birth, we at Ebong TheatriX pay our heartfelt respects to this remarkable theater director-actor. His legacy remains a testament to the enduring power of art and its ability to transcend time and culture.

### **Celebrating Centurions**



### Shobha Sen

Shobha Sen, born on the 17th of September 1923, in a quaint village of Faridpur, which now resides within modern-dau Bangladesh. She shines as a guiding star in the constellation of Bengali and Indian theater. In 1944, she embarked on her journey in the historical Bengali masterpiece "Nabanna," a pioneering torchbearer of Indian theater. She also took the helm as the leading lady in the groundbreaking Bengali film of 1950, Chinnomul, screenplau written by Satyajit Ray and directed bu Nemai Ghosh, the first cinematic narrative woven from the haunting tragedy of the partition.



For over half a century, from 1944 until 2017, her presence graced the Bengali stage and silver screen with her portrayal of characters leaving indelible imprints on our hearts. Her life's voyage was a testament to the ideals and social consciousness championed by the movement of Gananatya Sangha. As the wife of Utpal Dutt, another titan of Indian theater, her role in his artistic odyssey reads like a fairy tale spun from the loom of destiny. In 2010, she received the prestigious Mother Teresa International Award, a testament to her enduring impact. Her unforgettable performances in plays such as Ka/Joi, Angar, Barricade, Titumir, and Tiner Talowar have carved their niches in the annals of Indian theater history.

On the centenary of her birth, Ebong TheatriX cherishes her memory, and with the deepest reverence, we pay tribute to her monumental contribution to Indian theater, for she paved the path for the actresses of future generations.



### **Celebrating Centurions**

### Tapas Sen

Tapas Sen, born on the 11th of September 1924 in Dhubri, Assam, was the pioneer of light design in Indian theatre. People often asked him the secret of his love for his craft to which he responded: "I have gazed upon the hues of the setting sun, reflected in the Brahmaputra's embrace, each day since my inception. I've witnessed the flickering candlelight upon the fisherman's vessel, swaying to the river's rhythm, the shimmering sand dunes under the full moon's gentle caress, and the nocturnal ballet of fireflies in the dark abyss. They were my tutors." He, the untaught virtuoso, ascended the



throne of Indian theater without the formality of structured tutelage. In 1940, he embarked on his luminous journey as the master of light for the production "Jwala" by Indian People's Theater Association (IPTA). Swiftly, he expanded his repertoire, embracing myriad forms of performing arts—jatra, dance drama, puppetry, and more. In plays like Raktakarabi, Char Adhyay, Kallol, Setu, Manusher Adhikare, Mohakalir Baccha, Mahatma vs Gandhi or more recent, Kashinama or Janmodeen , he wove illusions with light that shall eternally grace the annals of Indian theater. He also wove the Indian "Son et Lumière," where light and sound danced in harmonious tandem. His enchanting spell still endures in Teen Murti Bhawan, Sabarmati Ashram, Ramrekha Ghat, Maan Mandir, the Old Fort of Delhi, the majestic Red Fort, and the regal Agra Fort.

Commencing with ancient techniques, it was his indomitable spirit that led the way for the dawn of modern light technology in Indian performing arts. Mere days before his demise, he bestowed his radiant touch upon the iconic Howrah Bridge, a beacon that now defines the skyline of Kolkata.

On the centenary of his birth, Ebong TheatriX remembers him, and with reverence, we pay homage to his monumental contribution to the rich tapestry of Indian theater.
